

# CLAUDE PEPPER AND LABOR: A GUIDE TO SELECTED MATERIALS IN THE CLAUDE PEPPER COLLECTION

Florida State University Libraries

Claude Pepper saw labor issues as central to a progressive and caring government. He urged labor and government to work together to develop a society that valued the input of its members, including its workers. Because he was regarded as one of labor's strongest supporters in Congress, he earned its endorsement in many political campaigns. As early as 1938, Pepper was involved in the passage of the first federal minimum wage act, guaranteeing workers a 25 cents per hour salary. In 1948, he co-sponsored an amendment to the Fair Labor Standards Act to raise the minimum wage to 75 cents per hour. It took two years to pass. One of his most significant contributions to the labor movement in this country was his leadership in the crusade to abolish mandatory retirement. This guide will help researchers locate selected materials in the Claude Pepper and Robert Manning Strozier Libraries that demonstrate his dedication to America's working people during his political career.
